
# what is a TIF?

Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Districts are a big deal in Chicago and a very big deal in the 27th Ward. TIF districts were originally created to give subsidies and public resources to private businesses to help them with construction projects and developments. They were intended to spur development in our poorest and most blighted communities.



#### how much have TIFs collected?


In 2011 TIFs extracted \$455 million in property taxes from the TIF districts across the city. The 280 suburban TIF districts diverted \$275 million. In total, the 443 TIF districts in Cook County captured **\$729 million** in property taxes in 2011.

## how does a TIF work?

When a TIF district is created, all the property taxes generated by the district in that year (called the "base amount") are tallied. After that, all property tax increases above the base (the "increment") are channeled to the TIF district.



at the end of 2011, there was \$1.39 billion left in TIF bank accounts ...

... yet the City claimed a budget deficit of \$636 million at the start of 2012.




